THE SUMMIT: A student discovers a meaningful connection to movement that enhances the quality of their lives. The student experiences joy in movement and is motivated to continue to pursue physical activity outside of school.

**SEARCHING** Student may find PE fun, but feel **indifferent** towards the place of physical activity in their lives. 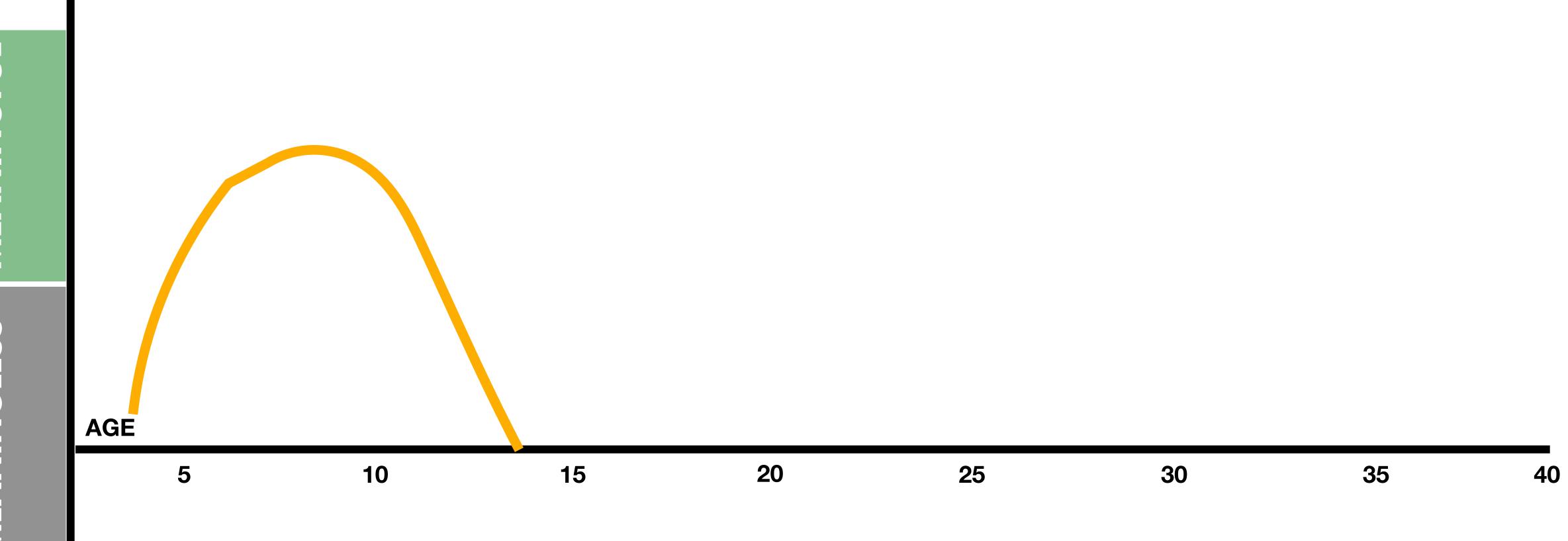


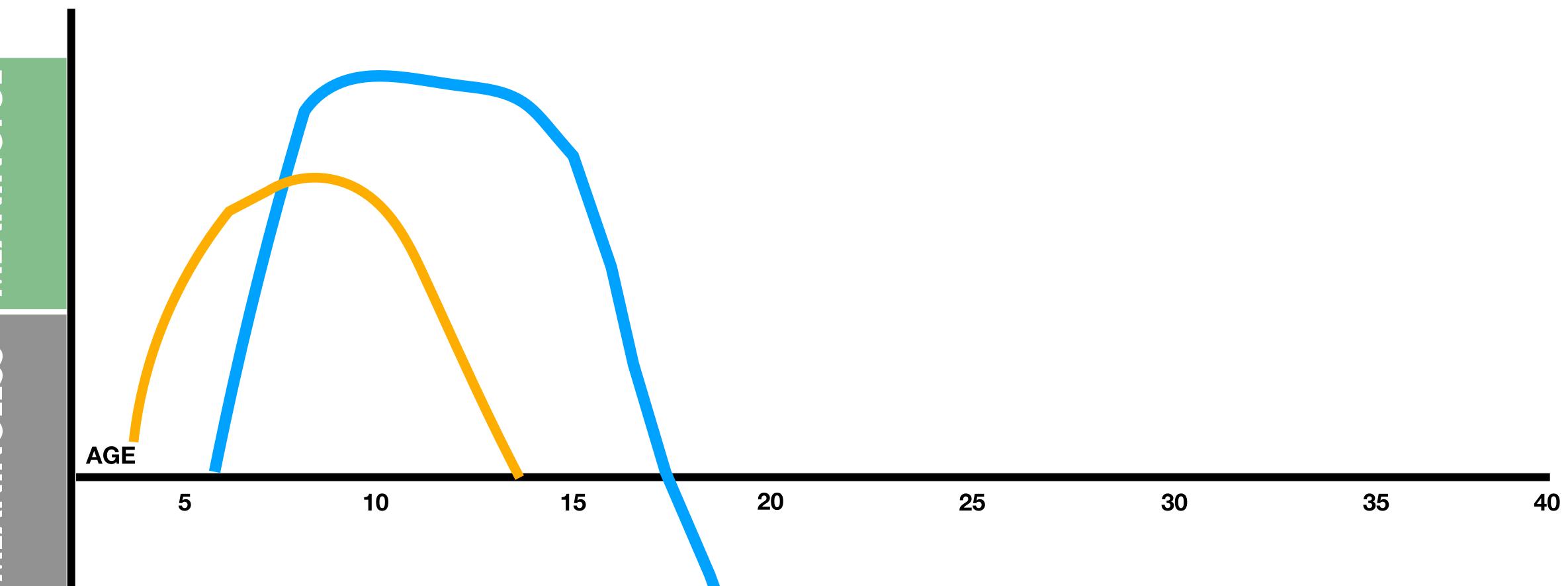


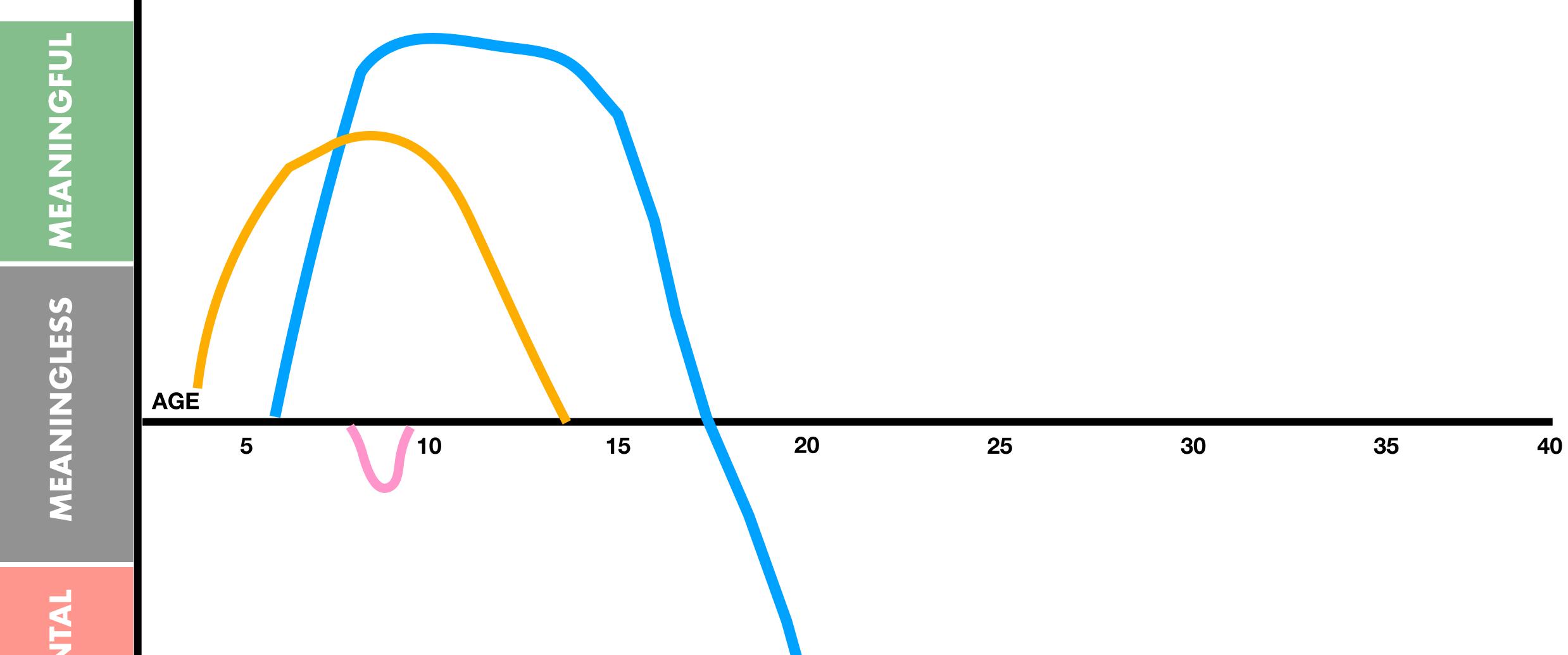
**DESCENDING:** PE has been **detrimental**, a source of stress and anxiety. Students merely seek to 'get through' each lesson, and are eager for class to end. Through experiences which are demeaning or embarrassing, the student is turned off of participation.

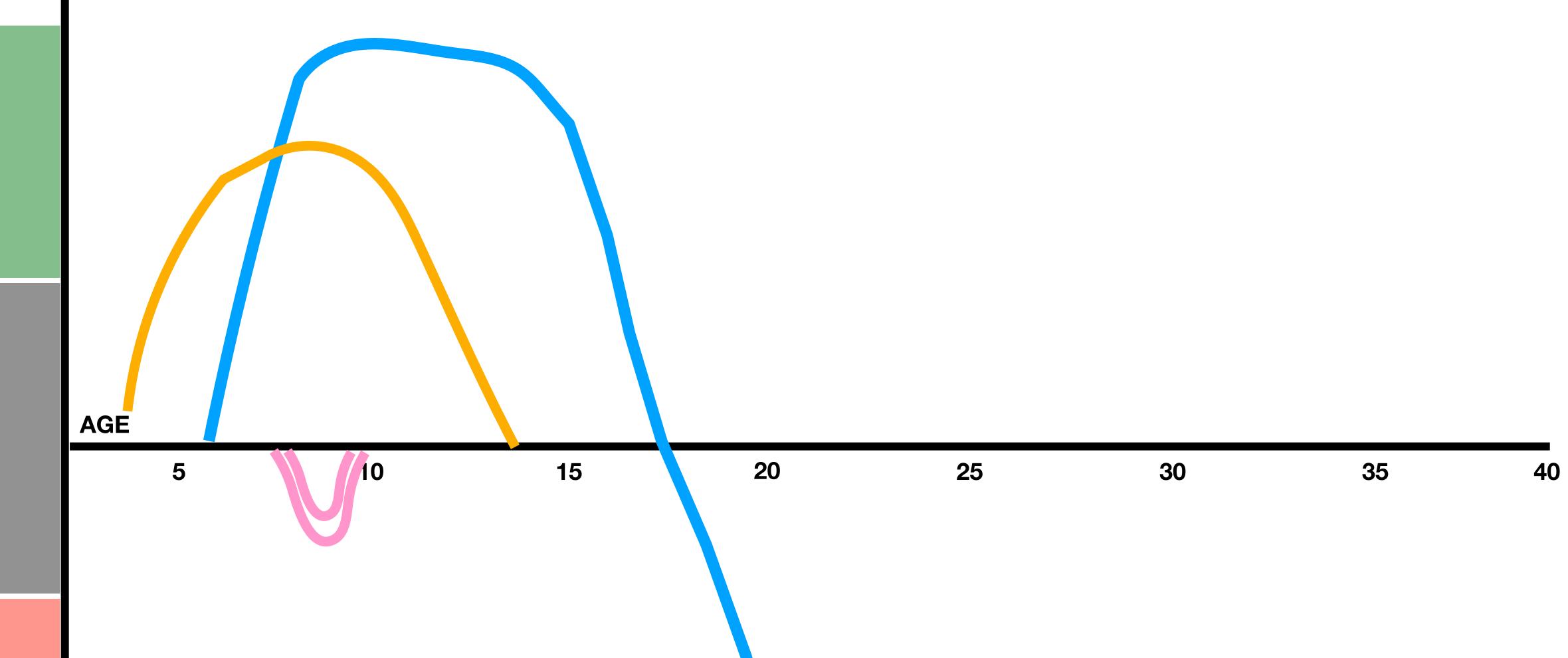

#### Curriculum Introduction, 2022

As students become physically literate, they develop the motivation, confidence, competence, and knowledge to value and take responsibility for participating in a wide range of physical activities across a lifespan. During physical education, students have meaningful learning opportunities to develop personal and social skills and behaviours as they interact respectfully within various indoor, outdoor, and alternative environments. Physical education enables students to experience the joy of movement through purposeful engagement in each of the following physical activity dimensions: rhythmic, gymnastic, expressive, individual and group, challenge and adventure, and cultural activities and games.

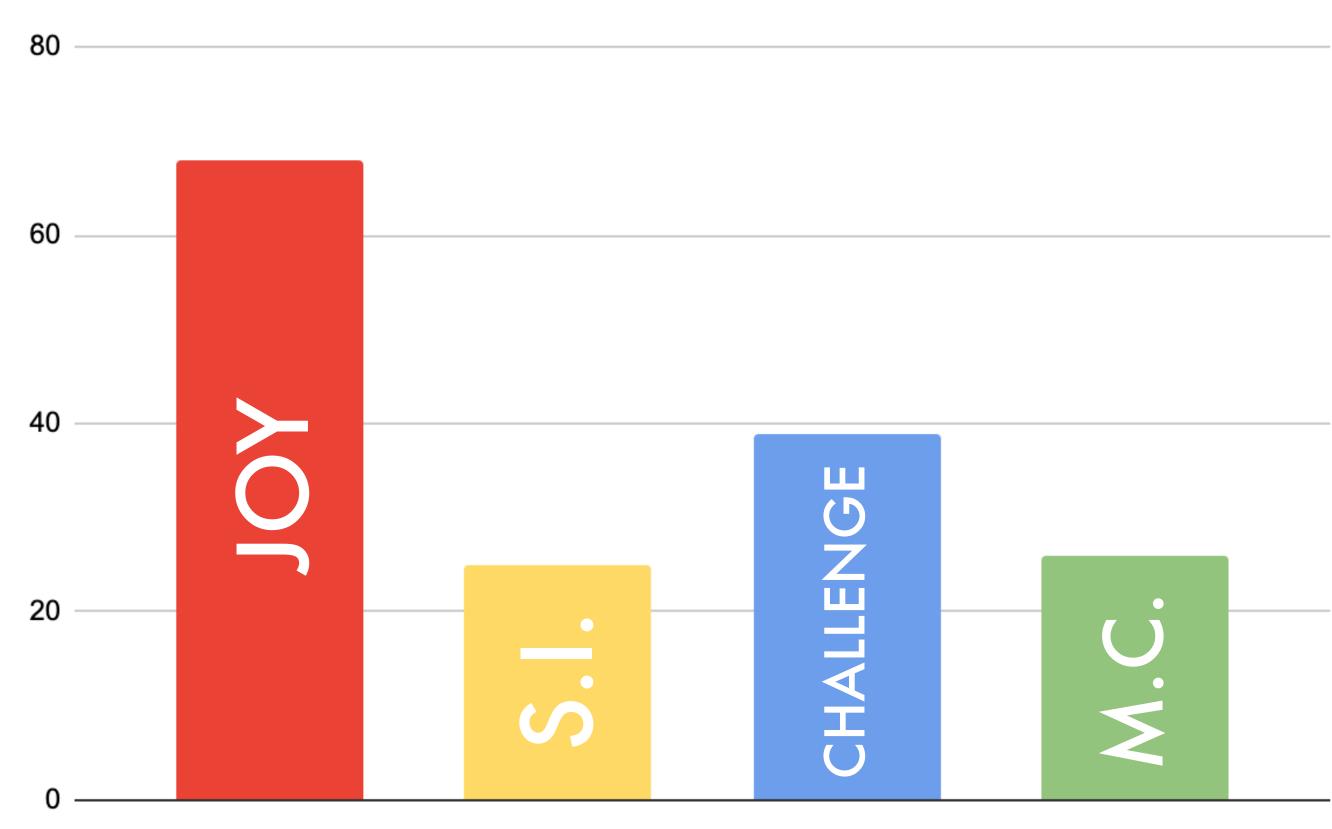

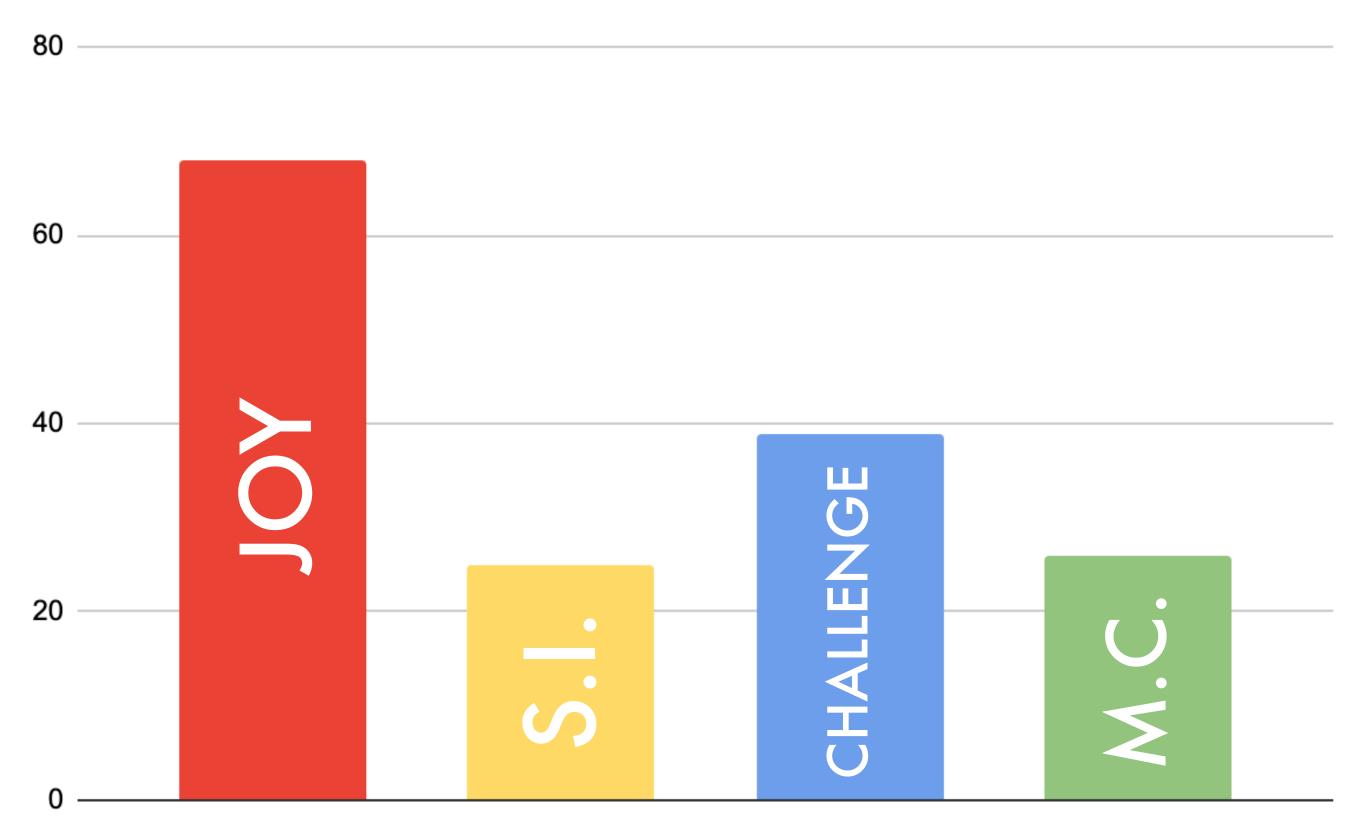
