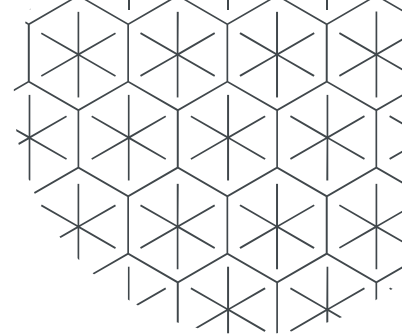

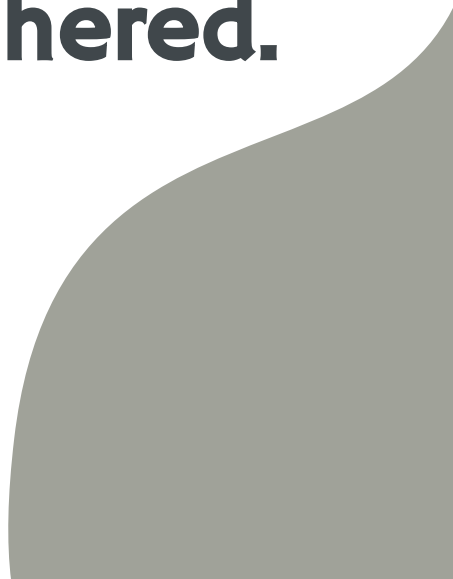
**The first statement is a conclusion. The other is not.**

2. Fish do not live in ponds.

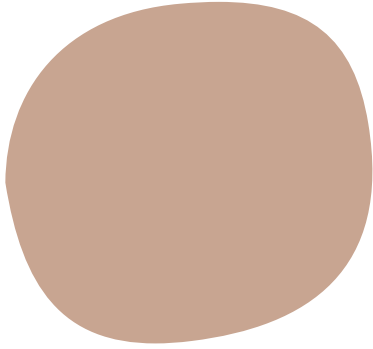

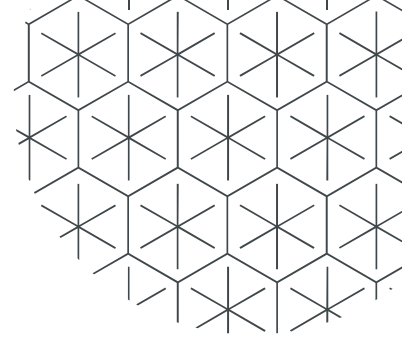
