GOVERNMENT IN A MARKET ECONOMY

Let's take the example of a company that manufactures paper products -from writing paper to cardboard boxes -- at a factory location on a river.
The problem is that, as a byproduct of its manufacturing operations, the
factory dumps chemical pollutants into the river. But no single person or
entity owns the river water, so there is no one to force the company to
stop polluting. Moreover, since cleaning up the river would cost money,
the company can sell its paper products more cheaply than if it had to
absorb such pollution-control costs. As a result, the paper company can
further increase its output, responding to the relatively higher demand at
its lower prices, leading to more waste and pollution from its factory.

Group calls for halt to oilsands development

A new alliance of local communities, environmental groups and Indigenous Peoples is forming to ensure the protection and health of the Athabasca River Basin. Recent news on the elevated contamination in the Athabasca and Peace Athabasca-Delta region has sparked the forming group to unite as Keepers of the Athabasca and stand in solidarity with fellow basin residents downstream.

The alliance of individuals, communities and groups is urging Premier Stelmach to support Fort Chipewan leaders' calls for a moratorium* on developments until there is proof that the lower Athabasca River and its people are not being harmed. The alliance also supports the need for further independent and peer-reviewed studies on the contaminants in the sediment, water, fish and wildlife in the Athabasca and Peace Athabasca-Delta regions.
